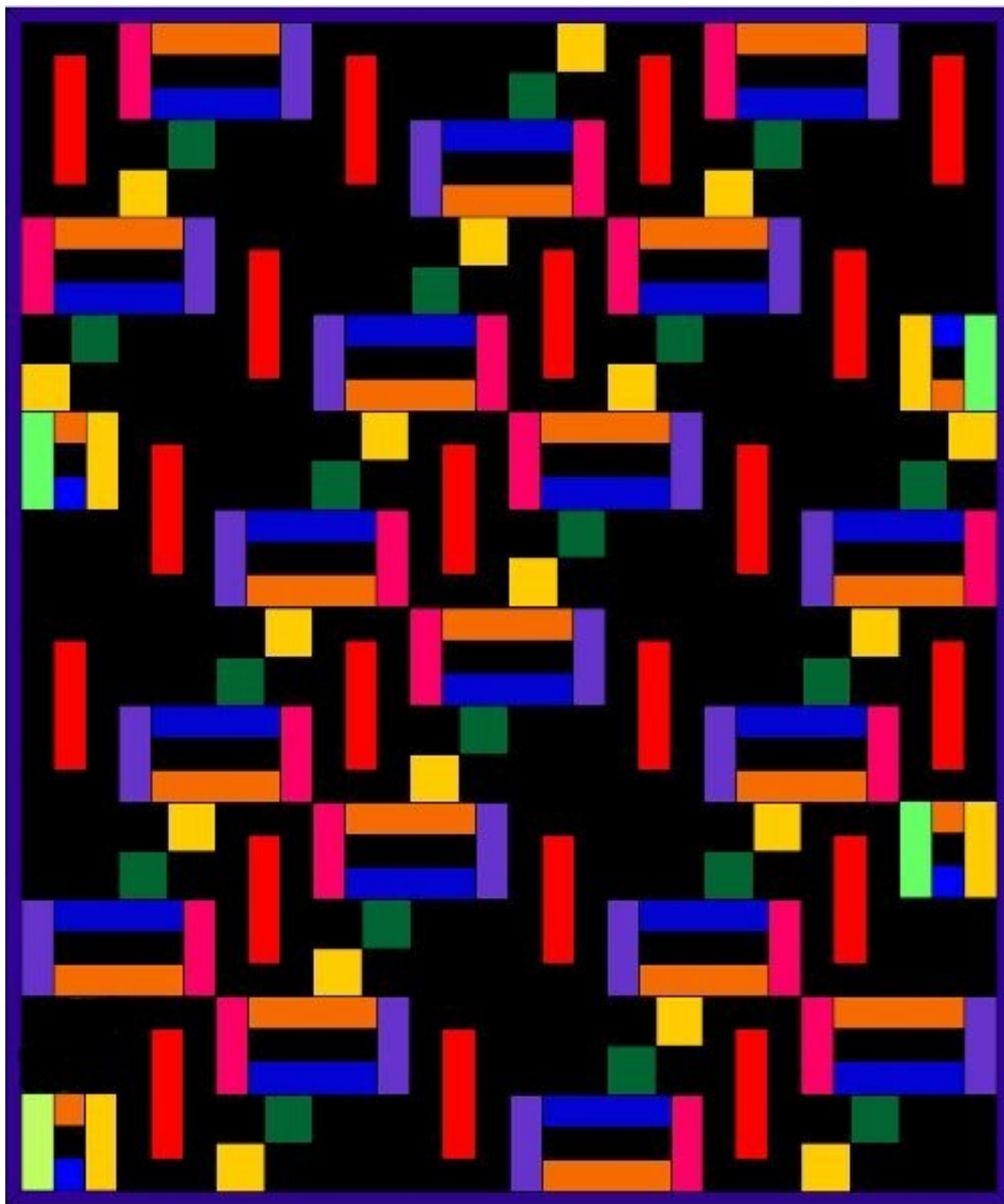


Wandering Ways Quilt Pattern:

You will need to purchase 3 yards of black Kona for this quilt. You will also need about a half of a yard for the red, blue, purple, pink, yellow, orange, and green fabric. Here is how to cut up the fabric.

- 22 6 1/2 inch black squares
- 36 3 1/2 inch black squares
- 18 3 1/2 inch yellow squares
- 18 3 1/2 inch green squares
- 20 2 1/2 x 8 1/2 inch red strips
- 58 2 1/2 x 8 1/2 inch black strips
- 40 2 1/2 x 6 1/2 inch black strips
- 18 2 1/2 x 8 1/2 inch blue strips
- 18 2 1/2 x 8 1/2 inch orange strips
- 18 2 1/2 x 6 1/2 inch purple strips
- 18 2 1/2 x 6 1/2 inch pink strips
- 4 2 1/2 black squares
- 4 2 1/2 blue squares
- 4 2 1/2 orange squares
- 4 2 1/2 x 6 1/2 inch yellow strips
- 4 2 1/2 x 6 1/2 inch green squares

You will need to make 20 of Block 1:



Sew a black 2 1/2 x 8 1/2 inch strip to a red 2 1/2 x 8 1/2 inch strip. Then sew a black 2 1/2 inch strip to the other side of the red. You will sew a 2 1/2 x 6 1/2 inch strip to the top and bottom of this block.

Make 20 of Block 2:



Sew a black 2 1/2 x 8 1/2 inch strip to a blue 2 1/2 x 8 1/2 inch strip. Sew the orange 2 1/2 x 8 1/2 inch strip to the other side of the black. Sew the 2 1/2 x 6 1/2 inch pink strip to the left and the 2 1/2 x 6 1/2 inch purple strip to the right.

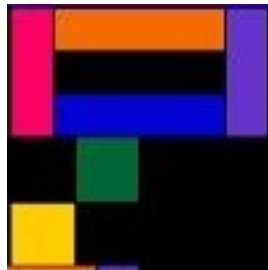
Make 20 of Block 3:



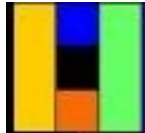
Sew a 3 ½ inch black square to a 3 ½ inch yellow square. Sew the 3 ½ inch green square to a 3 ½ inch black square. Sew those two strips together like in the picture. Now you want to sew a 3 ½ inch black square to the right of this square.

Then sew the colored block to the top of that strip. It should look like this once finished.

Block 5:



Make four of these blocks.



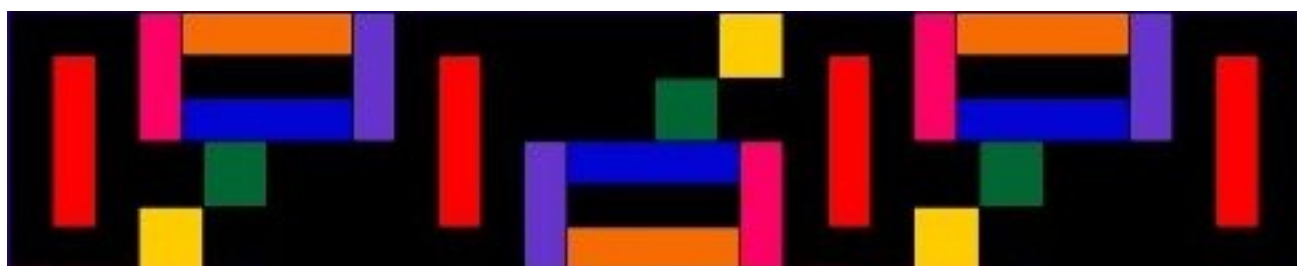
Sew the blue 2 ½ inch square to the black 2 ½ inch square. Then sew the orange 2 ½ inch square to the black. With the Blue square at the top and the orange square at the bottom. Now sew the yellow 2 ½ x 6 ½ inch strip to the left of the block and the 2 ½ x 6 ½ inch strip to the left. Now sew a 6 ½ inch black square to the top of this square like so.

Block 6:



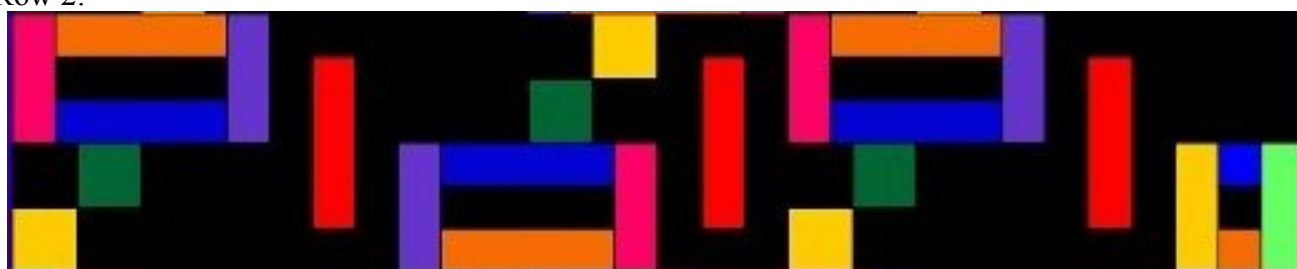
You need to pay close attention on how you sew the blocks together into rows. Or it won't look right.

Here is row 1:



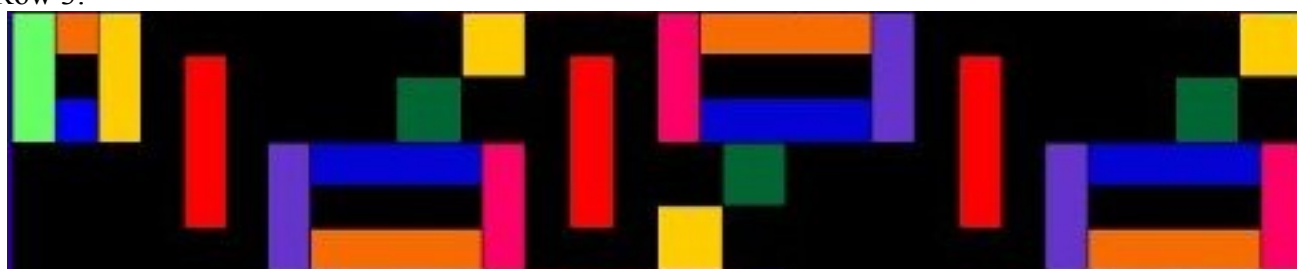
Block 1, block 5, block 1, block 5 (upside down) , block 1

Row 2:



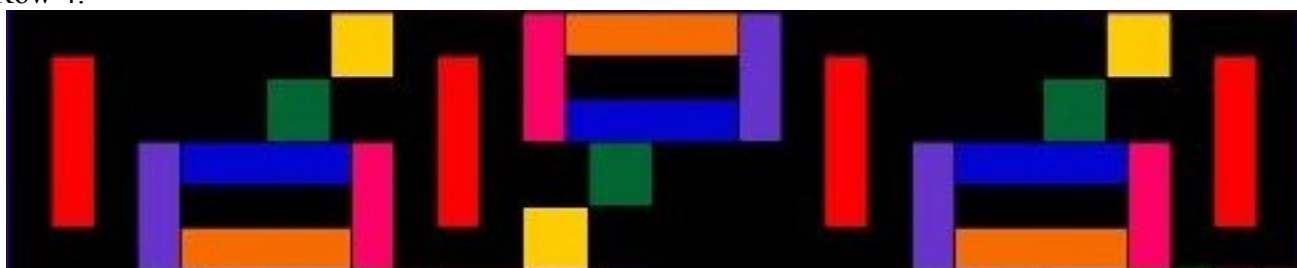
Block 5, block 1, block 5 (upside down), block1, block 5, block 1, block 6 with the black square on top.

Row 3:



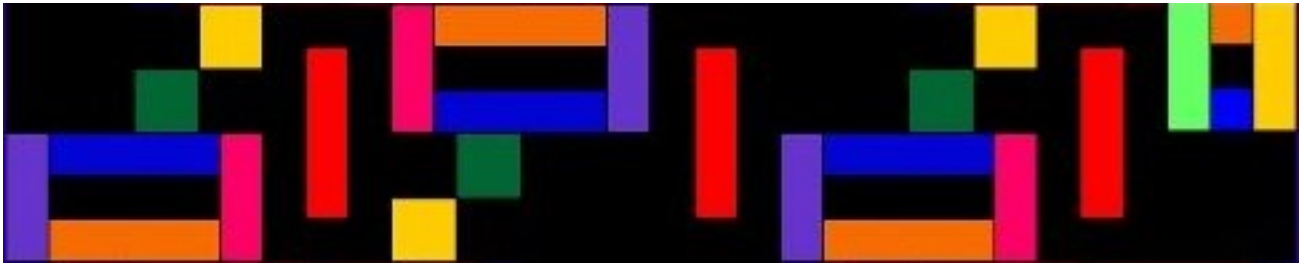
Block 6 (upside down), Block 1, block 5 (upside down), block 1, block 5, block 1, block 5 (upside down)

Row 4:



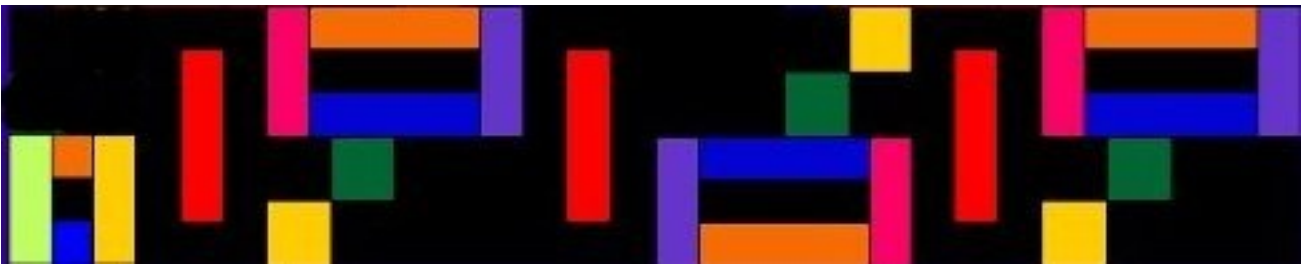
Block 1, block 5 (upside down), block 1, block 5, block 1, block 5 (upside down), block 1

Row 5:



Block 5 (upside down), block 1, block 5, block 1, block 5 (upside down), block 1, block 6 (upside down)

Row 6:



Block 6, block 1, block 5, block 1, block 5 (upside down), block 1, block 5

(Block 6 in this row has an error. It shows the blue on the bottom and it should be on the top in the actual quilt. The blue will always be next to the black 6 ½ inch square.)

Once you have the rows made sew them together. Add what ever border you like. I just bound it with out a border.
